Course 1: CPC Multi Agency Child Protection Procedures – 2 Full Days



Who should attend:

This course is primarily for frontline practitioners within all partner agencies who would be responsible for reporting a child protection concern and supporting a family during and throughout a child protection investigation. (General and Specific Workforce).

Learning Outcomes:

On completion of this course participants will:

- Be aware of the new National Guidance for Child Protection in Scotland 2021 (updated 2023)
- Be aware of Fife's implementation of the new National Guidance; Where We Are and Where We Are Going
- Be aware of the updated procedures in Fife specifically to Pre Birth IRD, ACRA IRD, CARM IRD, Child Protection Planning Meetings, MARAC and Information Sharing
- Be aware of the key concepts of Contextual Safeguarding
- Recognise the signs of abuse and neglect
- Know how to report a concern
- Understand the process that happens after a concern is raised (both with the Social Work Contact Centre, the Child Abuse Investigation Team and the Scottish Children's Reporter Administration)
- Understand the IRD, JII, Medicals, SCIM processes as well as how Housing can support a vulnerable family
- Understand and be able to apply relevant legislation and guidance
- Understand issues of consent and confidentiality.

Course 2: CPC Multi Agency Child Protection and Families Affected by Disability

Who should attend:

This course is primarily for frontline practitioners within all partner agencies who would be responsible for reporting a child protection concern and supporting a family during and throughout a child protection investigation (General and Specific Workforce). It is of particular interest to those working with children and staff working with children with disability including those with complex physical and communication needs.

Learning Outcomes:

- Increase knowledge about the abuse and neglect of children and young people with disabilities
- Understand current legislation, guidance and terminology
- Learn about specialist teams in Fife and how multi agency child protection procedures operate for children with disabilities.

Course 3: CPC Multi Agency Child Protection and Substance Use – Impact on Children and Families

Who should attend:

This course is primarily for frontline practitioners within all partner agencies who would be responsible for reporting a child protection concern and supporting a family during and throughout a child protection investigation (General and Specific Workforce). It is of particular interest to those working with unborn babies, children, teenagers and adults impacted by harmful substance use.

Learning Outcomes:

- Local & National context
- Impact on children of parental use
- Impact on children from their own use
- Working across a partnership
- Child's point of view/recovery/ whole family recovery
- Child Protection Procedures and recognizing harm caused by chronic substance use.

Course 4: CPC Multi Agency Child Protection and Return Discussions

Who should attend:

This course is for staff who would become notified of a child missing from their home or placement, either directly by Police or via the VPD system. It is of particular relevance to staff working in Residential Childcare, Police Scotland Responding Officers and Education staff (High School and Pupil Support Service).

Learning Outcomes:

On completion of this course participants will:

- be aware of the National Guidance 2021 (updated 2023)
- be confident in holding a Return Discussion
- be confident in sharing information captured within a Return Discussion
- be aware of the term Contextual Safeguarding
- be confident in the role of SCRA in relation to multiple missing episodes/VPD

Course 5: CPC Multi Agency Child Protection and Poor Parental Mental Health

Who should attend:

This course is primarily for frontline practitioners within all partner agencies who would be responsible for reporting a child protection concern and supporting a family during and throughout a child protection investigation (General and Specific Workforce). It is of particular interest to those working with unborn babies, children and young people impacted by poor parental mental health such as Midwives, Health Visitors, Education (all), Police Scotland Responding Officers, Social Work (all) and relevant third sector e.g. Fife Young Carers.

Learning Outcomes:

On completion of this course participants will be able to:

- raise awareness for the workforce about risks and protective factors in relation to mental ill health and child protection
- feel empowered to respond appropriately
- keep the child at the centre when thinking of poor parental mental health.

Course 6: CPC Multi Agency Child Protection for Social Workers (and others) Working with Adults (15+)

Who should attend:

This course is primarily for those working in adult services where their allocated service user have contact with children who may be vulnerable; either in their home, community, online or wider environment. This could be Adult Social Workers, Justice Workers, Police Scotland, Youth Intervention, NHS Fife; CAMHS, Education (High School, PSS) Housing, Clued Up, DAPL, Fife Young Carers...

This course can be counted as appropriate and relevant Child Protection training for SSSC registration for those working with adults.

Learning Outcomes:

- To be able to recall and be alert for signs of abuse and neglect
- To be aware of the changes in Fife in relation to the National Guidance for Child Protection 2021
- To be aware of child protection processes in Fife
- To be aware of the term 'Contextual Safeguarding'
- To be aware of the multi agency Vulnerable Young Person's Guidance

Course 7: CPC Multi Agency Child Protection Planning Meetings (CPPM)

Who should attend:

This course is primarily for frontline practitioners within all partner agencies who would be responsible for reporting a child protection concern and supporting a family during and throughout a child protection investigation (General and Specific Workforce) in particular those who may be called to Child Protection Planning Meeting. This includes staff in NHS Fife, Education, Police Scotland, Housing, Social Work and advocacy services.

Learning Outcomes:

On completion of this course participants will:

- Be able to understand their role before, during and after a Child Protection Planning Meeting
- Understand the format of a CPPM and the various roles within (e.g. Chair).

Course 8: CPC Multi Agency Child Protection and Child Sexual Abuse

Who should attend:

This course is designed for those working with children who may be at risk of, or have been victim of, child sexual abuse. It is focused on staff within Specific and Intensive roles such as; Social Worker, Police Scotland Public Protection Unit, NHS Paediatrician, GP, Health Visitor and Child Protection Coordinators in Education or Kingdom Abuse Survivors Project. Staff should be working in a role where you would support a child during, before and after the IRD process where the case is specifically related to Child Sexual Abuse; physical or non-contact.

Learning Outcomes:

Participants will feel confident in the following

- Explore and consider:
- Definition of Child sexual Abuse
- Online sexual harm
- Indicators of concern
- Recognising and responding to concerns
- Implications for assessment and intervention
- Relevant theory and research
- Supporting families.

Course 9: CPC Multi-Agency Vulnerable Young Persons Protocol - Information Session

Who should attend:

Anyone working in the General or Specific Workforce who supports vulnerable young people aged 15-18. ***It is important to note that if you work primarily with 18–25-year-olds you should attend the session on offer by Adult Support and Protection on the same topic.*** This CPC session is suitable for staff, for example working in Housing, Education, Special Education, School Nursing, Residential Childcare (Local Authority or Independent).

Learning Outcomes:

- To understand new updated guidance around vulnerable young people in relation to child protection processes (aged 16-25 depending on circumstances).

Course 10a: CPC Multi Agency Core Elements of Wellbeing, Welfare and Protection – Voice of the Child

Who should attend:

This course is designed for all practitioners who work directly with children and young people, and for supervisors who support those in direct practice. It is particularly relevant for professionals who have a responsibility to hear, interpret, and record the voice of the child — including social workers, teachers, health professionals, police officers, third sector staff, and others working across the child protection system.

Learning Outcomes:

Participants will:

- Develop a clear understanding of what constitutes the child's voice, including non-verbal communication.
- Explore common barriers and misconceptions that prevent children's voices from being heard.
- Understand the statutory and professional obligations to seek, record, and act upon the child's views.
- Learn practical strategies to amplify and evidence the child's voice in assessments, planning, and decision-making.
- Reflect on thematic learning from case reviews and consider how to improve practice across multi agency settings.

Course 10b: CPC Multi Agency Core Elements of Wellbeing, Welfare and Protection – When Services find it Hard to Engage (Disguised Compliance/Professional Curiosity)

Who should attend:

This course is designed for all practitioners and managers across agencies who work with children, young people, and families where engagement is challenging. It is particularly relevant for professionals who may encounter non-engagement, hostility, or disguised compliance in their practice — including social workers, teachers, health professionals, police officers, early years staff, housing officers, and third sector practitioners. Supervisors and managers who provide oversight and support in complex cases should also attend.

Learning Outcomes:

Participants will:

- Understand the principles and purpose of the guidance on working with families who are hard to engage, including its relationship to statutory child protection procedures.
- Recognise indicators of non-engagement, hostility, and disguised compliance, and understand their potential impact on a child's safety and wellbeing.
- Develop professional curiosity by exploring reflective questions and strategies to avoid drift, false reassurance, or minimisation of risk.
- Analyse risk effectively using patterns of behaviour, cumulative concerns, and the child's lived experience to inform decision-making.
- Apply practical strategies for safe, purposeful engagement with parents/carers, including de-escalation techniques and planning for practitioner safety.
- Strengthen multi-agency collaboration by understanding roles, responsibilities, and escalation pathways when engagement remains limited or hostile.
- Reflect on the emotional impact of this work and identify supports available through supervision, peer discussion, and organisational wellbeing resources.
